

He heals all your diseases

Psalm 103:2–3 “He forgives all your iniquity; He heals all your diseases.”

That passage comes from the **Book of Psalms**, a collection of poetic prayers and reflections in the Hebrew Bible.

Psalm 103:2–3 says:

“He forgives all your iniquity; He heals all your diseases.”

In context, David is praising God and listing the benefits of God’s mercy and care. The two lines work as a pair:

- **“Forgives all your iniquity”** emphasizes spiritual restoration—God removing guilt, wrongdoing, and moral failure.
- **“He heals all your diseases”** highlights God as the source of healing and restoration of the body.

A key point in interpretation is that Hebrew poetry often uses **parallelism**—two lines reinforcing a broader idea rather than making a strict one-to-one promise. So many readers understand this not as a guarantee that every physical illness is immediately healed in every case, but as a declaration of God’s role as the ultimate healer and restorer of both soul and body.

In the broader Psalm 103, the focus is on God’s compassion, patience, and restorative love—“who redeems your life from the pit” and “crowns you with steadfast love.”
